National Night Out is designed to: (1) Increase crime prevention awareness; (2) Generate support for- and relationships in- local anti-crime efforts; (3) Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships; and (4) Send a message to criminals by letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

National Night Out, sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) and co-sponsored locally by the **Monterey Park Police Department**, will involve over 10,000 communities from all 50 states, United States territories, Canadian cities and military bases around the world. In all,

over 34 million people are expected to participate in “America’s Night Out Against Crime” on August 5.
